During 2019, over 800 children from twenty-six primary schools over the five areas of Dublin City Council participated in Zoom@Hugh Lane Gallery. The ratio of DEIS to non-DEIS schools was 4:1. It is our ambition to work with every primary school in the Dublin City Council area and Phase II of Zoom@Hugh Lane Gallery has begun with an additional twenty six schools participating. Through this project we aim to enable the creative potential of every child through gallery visits to look at, discuss, sketch and make art during artist-led workshops. Green screen animation is used to capture the children's interaction with artworks and their creativity is celebrated in a short film produced by artist Liliane Puthod and available to view on the Gallery's website. We are very grateful to artists Jane Fogarty, Frances Coghlan, Rebecca Shelford, Ashleigh Downey and Kathryn Maguire who led the workshops featured in this film. *Zoom@Hugh Lane Gallery is curated by Jessica O'Donnell, Head of Education and Community Outreach, Hugh Lane Gallery and Liliane Puthod, Project Facilitator.
