


Next up was the 'Role of Sketchbooks' with artist Ashleigh Downey. Ashleigh spoke about the importance of using sketchbooks and all the ways they can be used. The group spent time making their own hand-made sketchbooks to use throughout the programme and beyond!



The group finished the day with a 'Visual Thinking Strategies' session with artist Claire Halpin, focusing on works in the large-scale Andy Warhol exhibition 'Three Times Out'. VTS is an explorative method to discuss artworks, with observations contributed by participants in response to the artworks and a series of specially developed VTS questions.

The first task on Day 2 was to brainstorm in groups and prepare questions for staff members in roles across different departments of gallery activity - Exhibitions, Collections, Education and Conservation.



After the group had explored the topics and came up with a range of questions, Meabh Delaney, the Assistant Exhibitions Curator, gave them a presentation. She spoke about the role and many tasks of a curator, and shared about her own interests and journey to becoming a curator!



Later on Day 2, the group worked in their sketchbooks and on drawing boards to explore works on display from the gallery collection. They each selected two works of interest to respond to through drawing and text.





Day 3 began with an enquiry based exploration and discussion of a selection of artworks from the collection. This was the first of two sessions led by artist and educator Sarah Ward, a new member of the Hugh Lane Gallery Artist Panel! Freelance panel members deliver a range of gallery workshops, tours, talks and events.







From the Education department, Eimear Murphy, artist and Zooom@Hugh Lane Gallery Project Facilitator, joined the group to give a presentation and to lead a brainstorming activity.



Participants formed smaller groups to come up with art ideas together, for education programmes that would interest a specific group or demographic such as teens.





The first week ended with a double print-making session led by artist and TY Programme Facilitator Michelle Hall. During the first half of the workshop participants explored creating A4 mono-prints using a range of mark-making and stencil techniques.





During the second half of the workshop the group worked with portraits using an A3 acetate sheet and print-outs. They chose a range of portraits to work from including celebrities, musicians, artists, animation characters and self-portraits. The workshops were assisted by Sarah Ward.








Week 2 kicked off with an illustrated talk by Aoife Convery titled 'Innovators in Focus', looking at the lives and work of three remarkable women - Sarah Purser, Lady Mary Heath and Sarah Cecilia Harrison. The group met with Ashleigh Downey again, and used their hand-made sketchbooks for an in-gallery drawing session, exploring works by Andy Warhol.

The afternoon brought a fascinating visit to the Conservation Studio with presentations by Lucia Fabbro, Head of Conservation, and all of the conservation team, followed by a visit to the Francis Bacon Studio led by AnneMarie Saliba, the Assistant Collections Curator at the gallery.






