Sketch your favourite animal below!

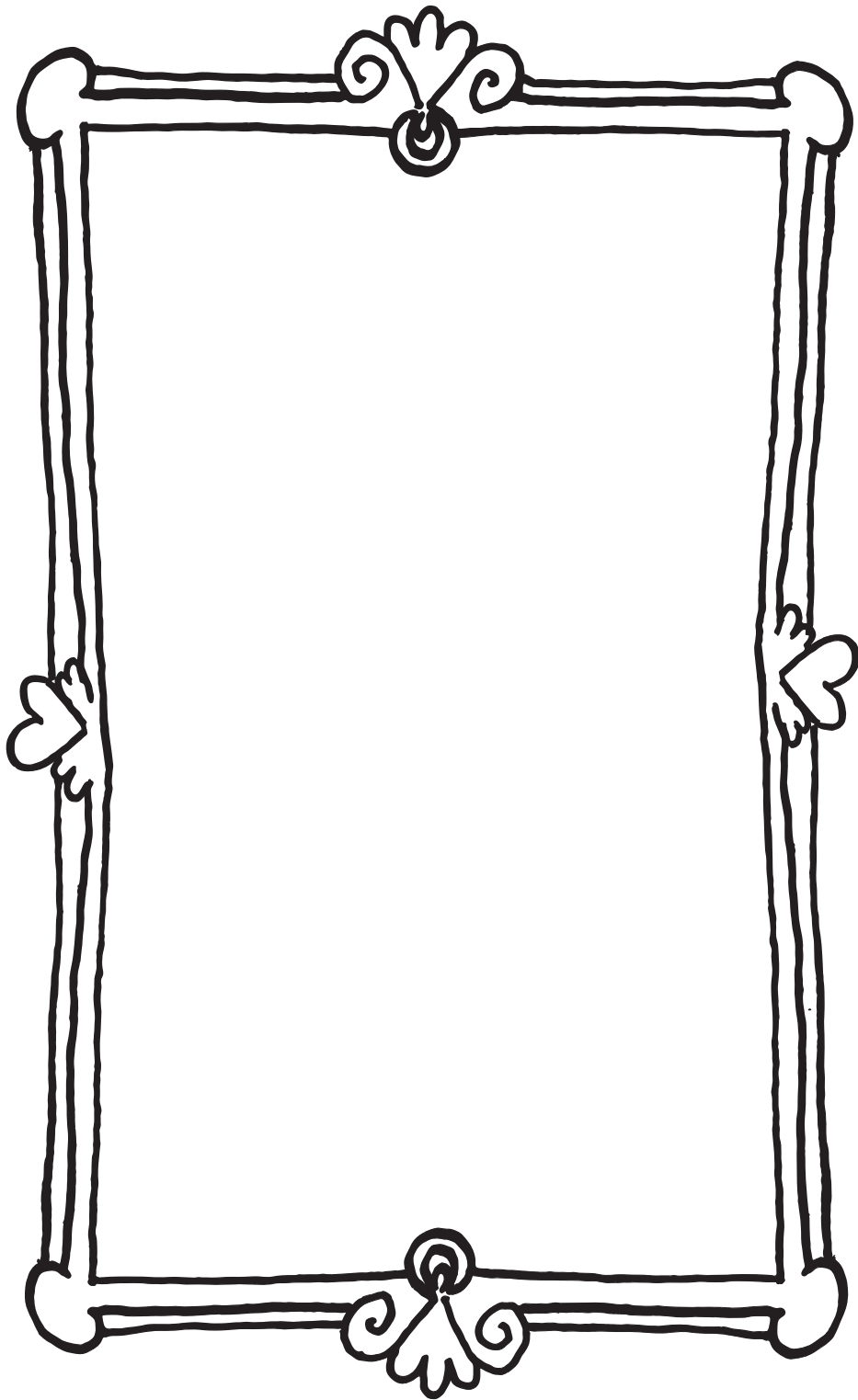
Can you list all the different types of animals **Harry Clarke** has included in this stained glass artwork?

Create your masterpiece here!

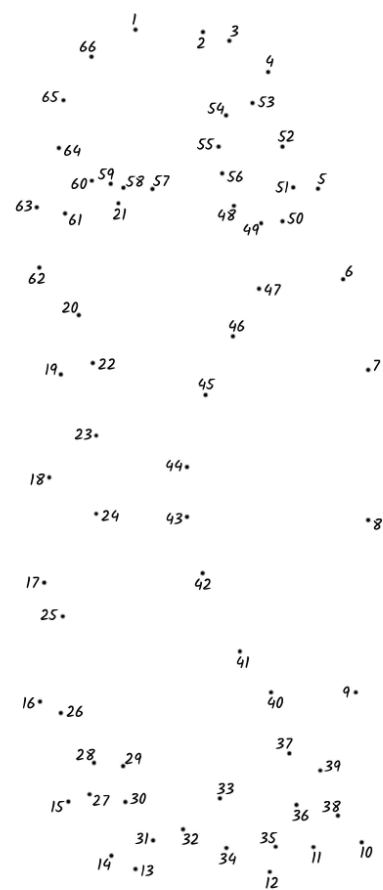

Join the dots and find the artwork...

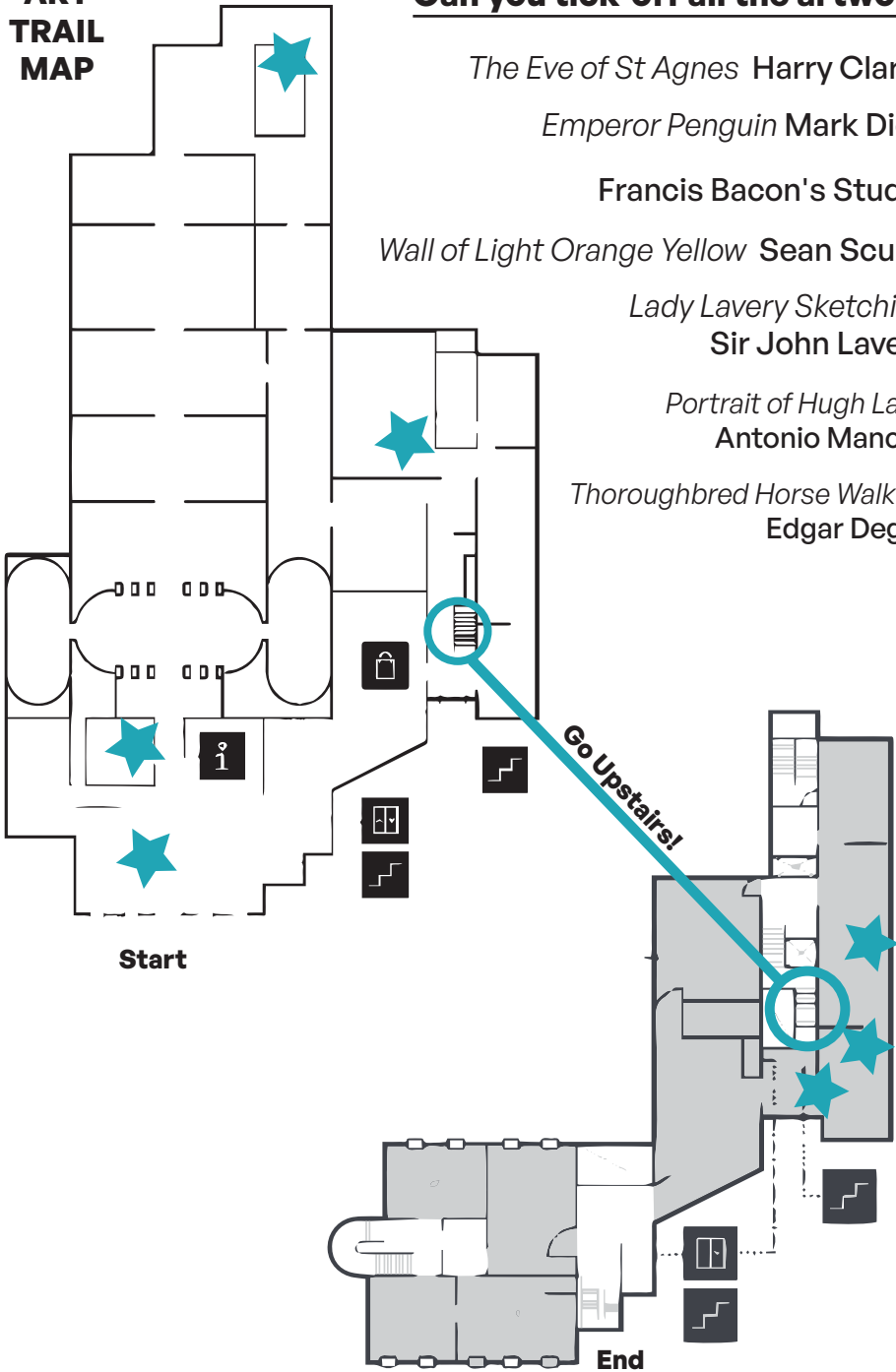

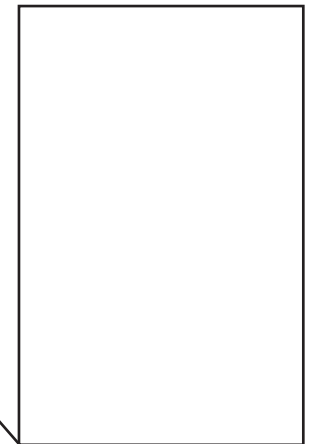


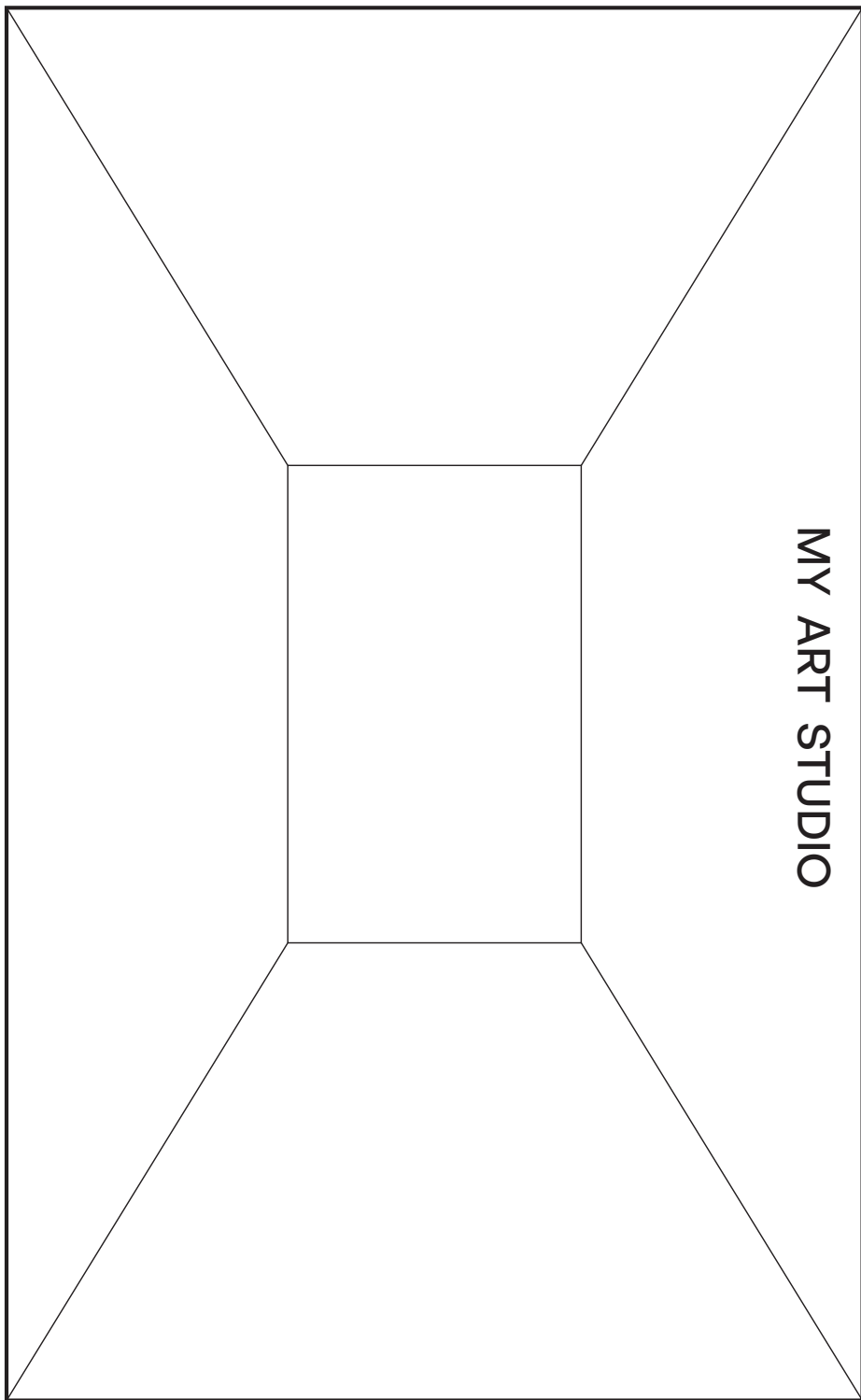
Next stop is to find this unusual view! This is the real studio of painter **Francis Bacon**, brought from London and reassembled here (even the walls!)

Can you find the portholes?

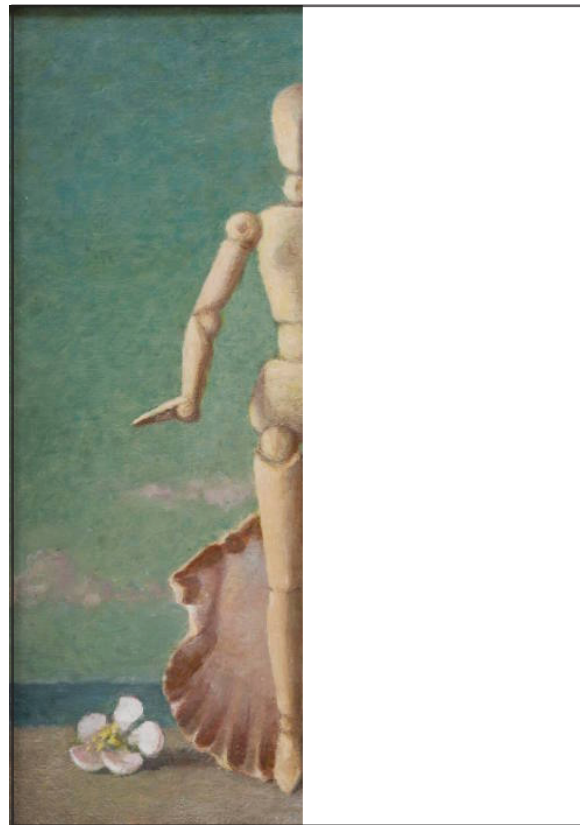

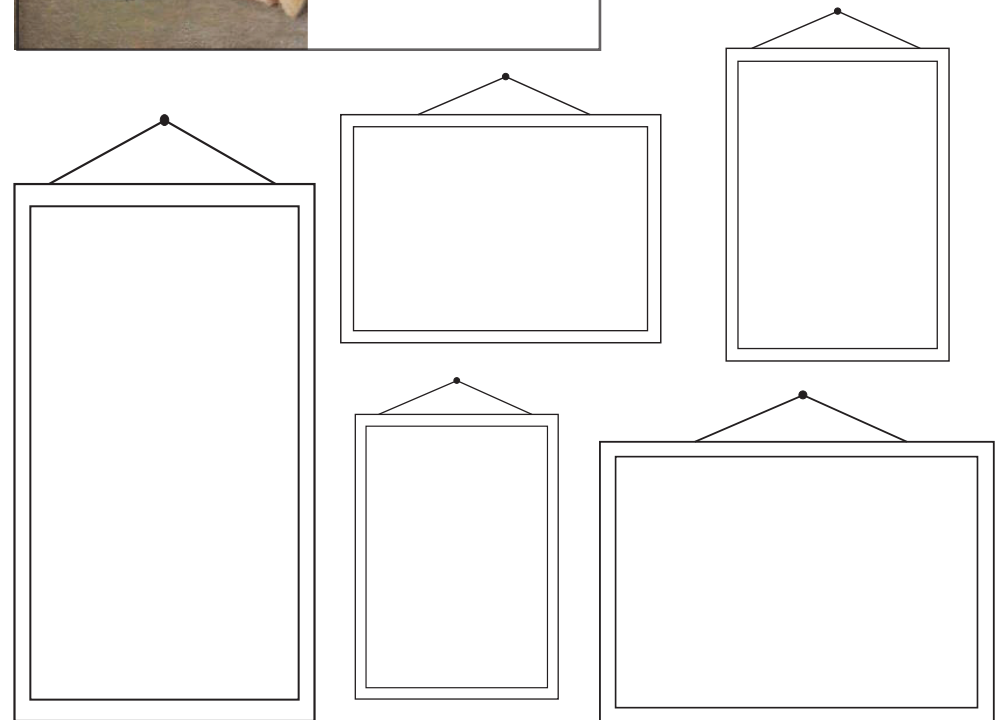


If you had an artist's studio, what would it look like? What would you have in it?

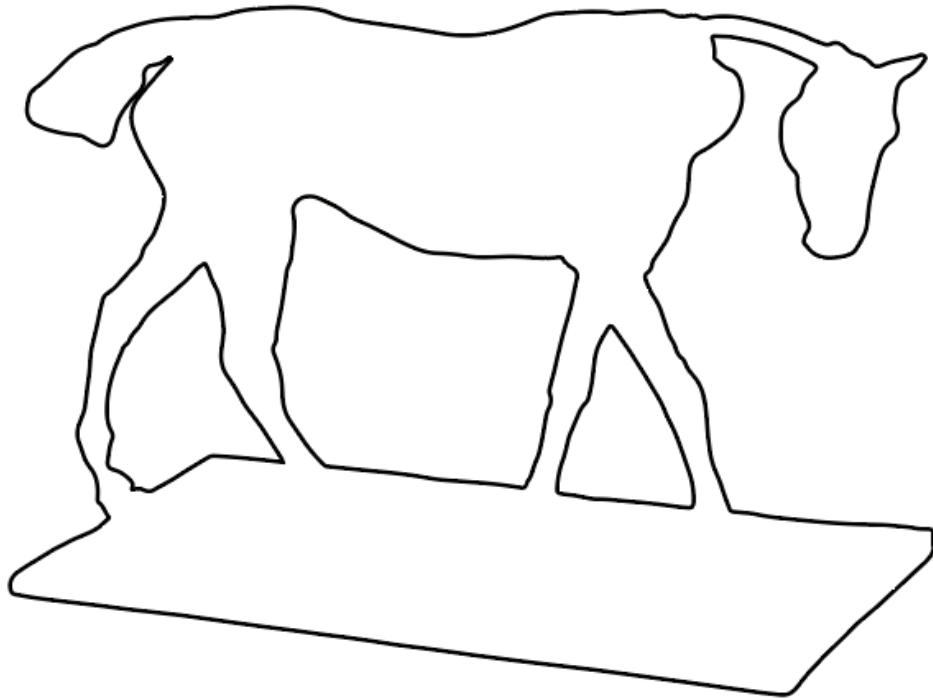

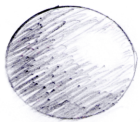
Artists sometimes use wooden figures as a great way to practice drawing the different shapes that make up the body! Can you draw the figure in different poses?



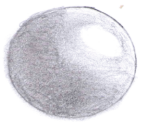

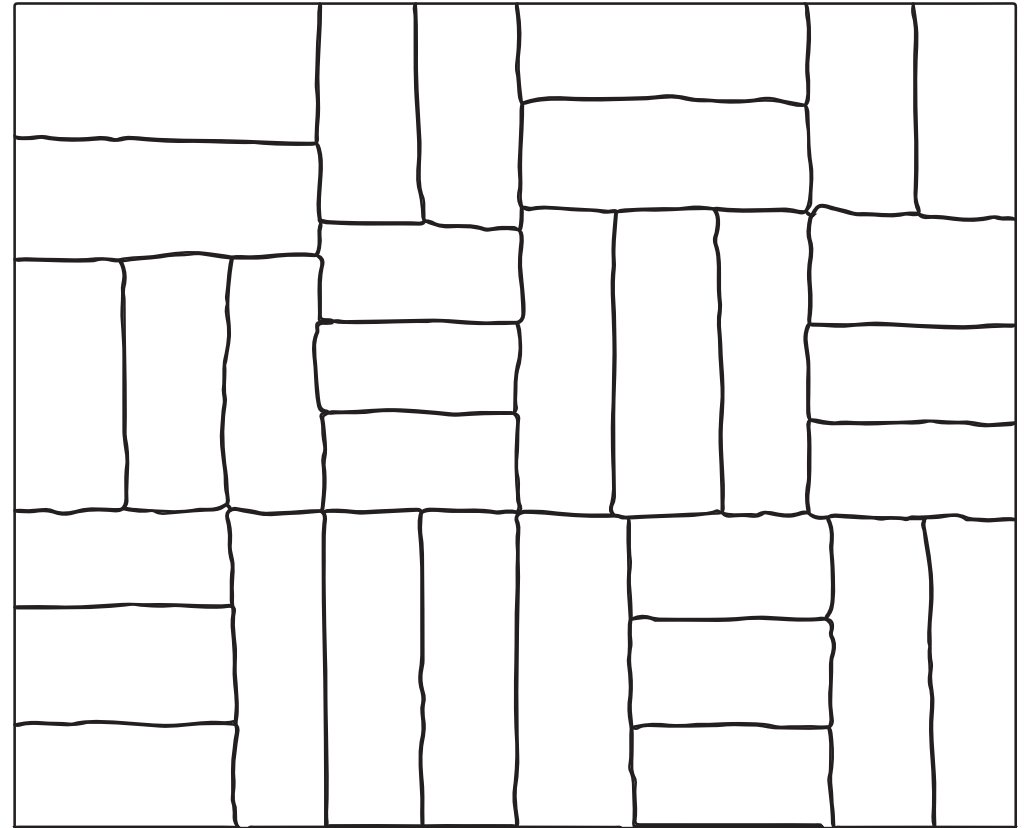

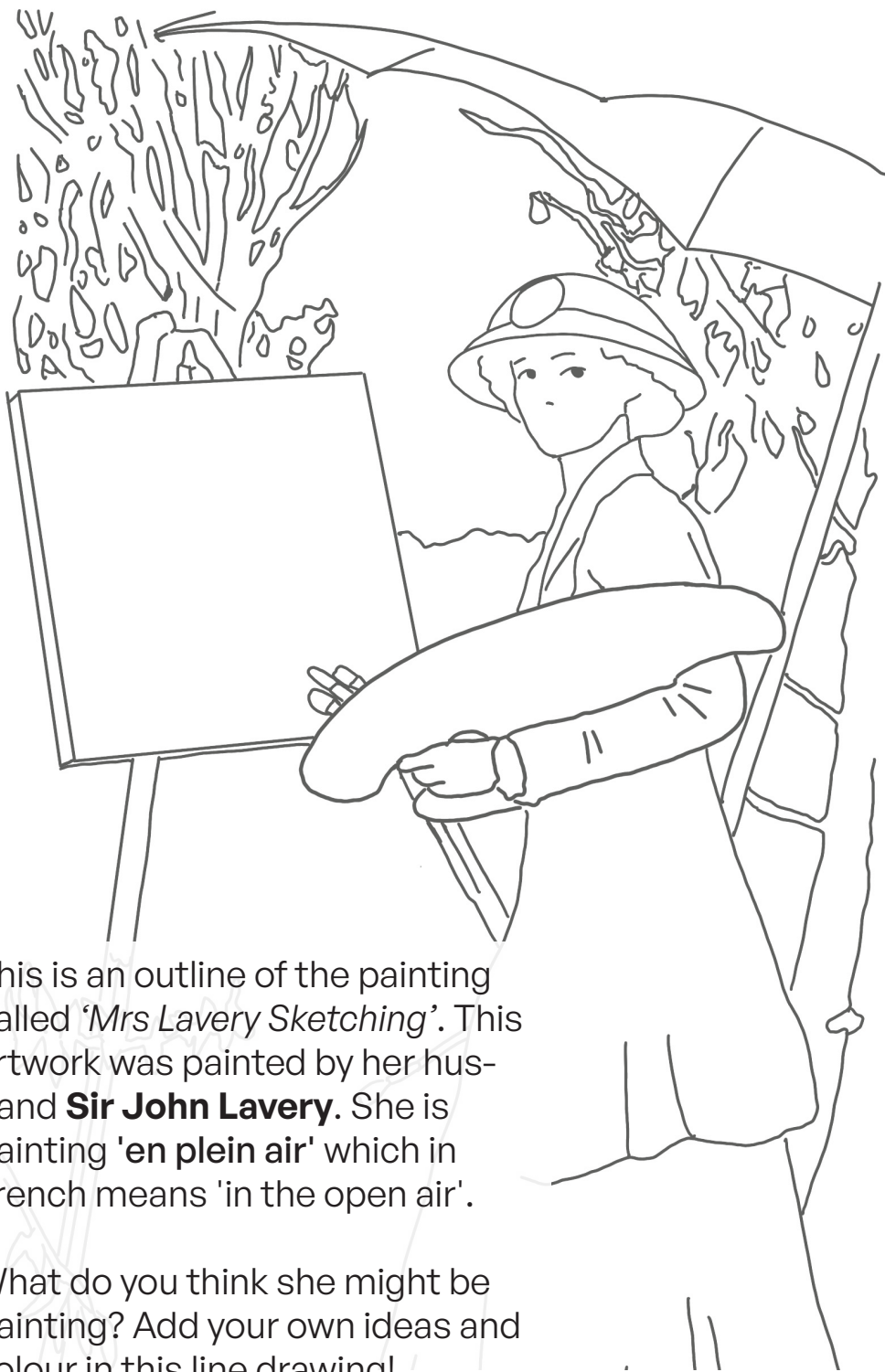
Top Tip: Keep in mind where the light is coming from...
